The first year of legalization in California was an eventful one for HCGA, for our members, and for the cannabis industry. A lot happened in 2018, a lot has changed—and a lot of exciting new possibilities and challenges are on the horizon.

On the advocacy front, at the end of 2018 we severed HCGA's contract with the California Growers Association. Since then, we have been building out HCGA's own government affairs program, contracted with Jason Bryant Government Affairs in Sacramento, and held an election with the membership to seat our Policy Committee. We are also now holding weekly, web-based Industry Affairs calls with the entire membership. Our commitment is transparent, accountable decision-making to establish HCGA's policy positions and to ensure that our members have a seat at the table providing credible, actionable input on policy decisions.

Our top priorities in Sacramento for 2019 include passing SB 67, which would extend temporary licenses; SB 34, the Compassion Bill; and SB 185 which would expand California's organic program to include manufactured products, as well as clarification around the appellations of origins, both programs are mandated to begin in 2021. HCGA is also making progress locally. Despite growing pains and ongoing challenges, Humboldt County's cannabis industry is doing especially well compared to other California regions. This past year we have passed the second land use ordinances (both with CEQA compliance) and worked with the supervisors to amend the county cultivation tax to allow for greater flexibility. This gives Humboldt farmers a welcome chance to catch their breath in the marathon that began when we started down this path of legalization, regulation and restructuring.

On the public relations front, HCGA has long been pushing for a unified "county of origin" marketing campaign to promote Humboldt County cannabis products to consumers across the state. After nearly two years of brainstorming, negotiating, and seemingly endless meetings, in November 2018 the supervisors directed staff to move ahead on figuring out ways to support the local cannabis industry. In March 2019 the county unveiled Project Trellis, which includes a Humboldt County cannabis marketing strategy along with micro-grants and an equity program. HCGA will remain engaged with this process in order to maximize opportunities for our members, and continue to advocate that the Humboldt County cannabis story is told with absolute community engagement and buy-in.

On the education front, HCGA continues to help members develop the business acumen necessary for success, in a growing industry that is still defining itself. In addition to our ongoing webinars and workshops, we recently submitted a grant proposal to the Headwaters Board to build out a new program for "Specialty Agriculture and Niche Manufacturing Workforce Training." This is a competitive process, so we do not yet know the outcome, but if we're successful, then HCGA will start hosting low- or no-cost educational seminars in summer 2019 for owner/CEOs, mid-managers, and entry-level employees so that our businesses have the requisite skills to survive and thrive.

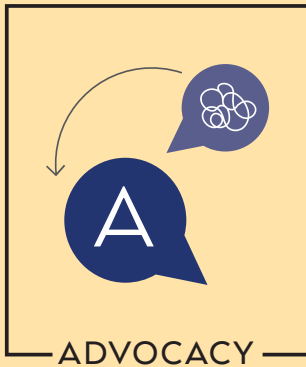
On the networking front, our newest staff member, Heather Luther, is leading our efforts to help HCGA members connect with industry-adjacent businesses through our Allied Industry Business program. As we all know, plant and product cannabis businesses aren't the only folks in Humboldt County whose livelihood depends on the cannabis industry. Success for all requires reciprocity, cooperation, and mutual support. HCGA Allied Industry Business Members include accountants, attorneys, marketing professionals, business management consultants, equipment suppliers, staffing firms, commercial lenders, and more. By integrating these allies into HCGA, we're able to secure valuable resources and loyal friends.

The legal and logistical framework under which our industry operates is still continually evolving, so it may remain the case for a while yet that we're "building the plane while we're flying it." However, the gains and growth achieved in 2018, and the promise of more advances in 2019, demonstrate that HCGA is making undeniable progress as we work to preserve, protect and enhance Humboldt County's world-renowned cannabis industry. Let us continue to grow together as an organization!

HCGA represents the interests of our membership to state and local government. We lobby for sensible public policy, collaborate with regulators and key stakeholders, and support responsible research on issues and challenges facing the cannabis industry. HCGA members contribute to these efforts via transparent, democratic, representative committee processes.

HCGA legislative activities in 2018 included:

- Multiple trips to Sacramento
- Conference calls with regional partners
- A thousand+ phone calls
- In-person meetings
- Coalition building across the state
- Engagement with state agencies

California Legislative Session

It takes a lot of effort to “work a bill.” So in 2018, HCGA worked in strategic partnership with the California Growers Association (CalGrowers), with HCGA Executive Director Terra Carver chairing the CalGrowers’ Policy Committee. In 2018, CalGrowers tracked more than 100 pieces of legislation with potential to impact the cannabis industry. Nine CalGrowers-sponsored or -supported bills were signed into law by the end of session.

Legislation Signed by the Governor

AB 2020

Temporary Events: Any Permitted Location

Allows temporary cannabis events to be held at any locally permitted venue. Previously, events could only be held at county fairgrounds or district agricultural associations.

SB 311

Commercial Cannabis Activity: Licensed Distributors

Allows a cannabis product to be transferred between licensed distributors after certified testing. Previously, a product could only be transported from a distributor to a retailer following testing. This legislation is effective immediately due to an urgency clause.

SB 1459

Cannabis: Provisional License

Creates a new “provisional license” as a bridge between temporary and annual licenses. Provisional licenses are exempt from the CEQA findings that are required for annual licenses.

SB 1294

Cannabis: State and Local Equity Programs

Creates a state equity program that includes technical assistance and low-interest grants and loans.





Legislation Vetoed by the Governor Brown



SB 829

Compassionate Care Licenses

Would have created a new “compassionate care” license, available to M-licensees, for businesses that donate cannabis to patients for free. Donated cannabis would have been exempt from state taxes. The governor’s stated reason for the veto was that the legislation would have conflicted with the intent of Prop 64.

CalGrowers Position: Support

Legislation Held in Legislative Committee



AB 2641

Temporary Events: Producer Sales

Would have allowed cultivators and manufacturers to sell their own products at permitted cannabis events. Instead, only licensed retailers are currently authorized to sell at cannabis events. The bill passed the Assembly but was held in the Senate appropriations committee.

CalGrowers Position: Support

AB 2555

Cannabis: Mature Plants

Would have defined a mature plant at eighteen inches of height or width and required a UID to be affixed at that point. The bill passed the Assembly but was pulled from the Senate floor.

CalGrowers Position: Oppose Unless Amended



Humboldt County Policy Advances

HCGA maintains ongoing engagement with Humboldt County's Board of Supervisors, Planning Department, Planning Commission, Sheriff, Agricultural Commissioner, Treasurer/Tax Collector, and County Economic Development Department, as well as Cities of Eureka, Arcata, Rio Dell and Fortuna.

Throughout 2018

HCGA staff attended the twice-monthly Humboldt County Planning Commission hearings, to provide support for member projects as they seek approval for their Conditional Use Permits.

February 2018

HCGA supported a recommendation that the Board of Supervisors pass interim permits for remaining county permit holders. This important policy ensures that some of our pre-existing operators have a pathway forward for temporary licenses.

March 2018

HCGA successfully advocated for amendments to the cultivation tax ordinance, "in order to bring clarity, transparency and leniency" including reduced the penalties for nonpayment of cannabis cultivation taxes; allow growers to reduce the size of their gardens; and grant refunds on 2017 cultivation taxes paid by permit holders who can demonstrate that they didn't wind up growing any crops last year.

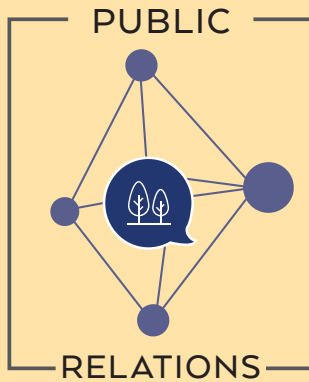
After nearly two dozen public meetings, the Humboldt County Board of Supervisors passed its second Commercial Cannabis Land Use Ordinance. HCGA attended every meeting, with specific focus on how "Ordinance 2.0" would impact our "Ordinance 1.0" members.

October 2018

the City of Eureka voted to adopt an ordinance allowing on-site consumption of cannabis at licensed retail establishments. HCGA staff and members met with city officials and council members to talk about ways the city could allow for on-site enjoyment, and about opportunities for tourism.

Working in conjunction with the Southern Humboldt Visitors Bureau, the Humboldt-Eureka Visitors Bureau and Visit Eureka, HCGA worked to ensure that cannabis had a seat at the table, and would be included in discussions about coalition building with tourism groups and new approaches to attract visitors to Humboldt County.





HCGA works to encourage positive public perception of the regulated cannabis industry, to deter negative images and stereotypes, and to build mutually beneficial relationships with the Humboldt County community of which we are an important part. We accomplish this through demonstrating the value that a professional, well-regulated cannabis industry brings to Humboldt County through its contributions of tax dollars, jobs, and commitment to social responsibility and environmental stewardship.



HCGA Public Relations Activities In 2018

- 01 Foundational work to launch Humboldt County of Origin marketing campaign
- 02 Press tour with Papa & Barkley to Dave and Lorelie Sandomeno's Sunrise Mountain Farm, for a Forbes article about craft cannabis, appellation and artisanal product lines
- 03 Participation on two different "Let's Talk Tourism" panels hosted by the Southern Humboldt Visitors Bureau, to discuss tourism, marketing and destination development in southern Humboldt
- 04 Hosted several private tours to showcase farms and develop stock photo content for media requests
- 05 Co-hosted a tour with the Southern Humboldt Visitors Bureau introducing Humboldt Eureka Visitors Bureau members to a dispensary, One Log House, and Huckleberry Hill farm
- 06 Co-hosted the Board of Directors of Rural County Representatives of California. This tour provided opportunity for elected officials from rural counties, most of which are "ban" how cannabis can be done well.

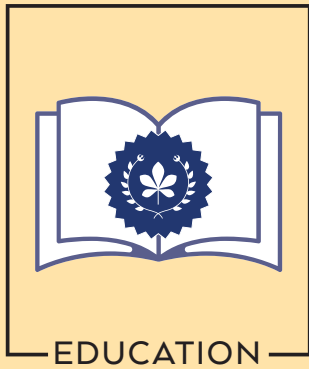
Economic and Market Development

Since HCGA's inception, one of our main goals has been to help advance a consumer-facing campaign to promote Humboldt cannabis products to consumers across the state.

Since 2017, we've been talking about this need and various ways it could be accomplished. In November 2018, the Board of Supervisors directed county staff to look at ways they county could reinvest in economic development through supporting the cannabis industry, and specifically developing a "county of origin" marketing campaign.

Our work throughout 2018 paid off in March 2019, when Project Trellis, a multi-pronged approach that includes not only a marketing plan, but also an equity program and micro-grants/loans was unveiled. Project Trellis was approved by the Board of Supervisors in March 2019.





Knowledge is power, and HCGA works to empower its membership by providing expert educational opportunities at in-person and webinar-based professional development workshops. We host and co-host B2B supply chain networking events. Through our Governmental Affairs program and weekly Industry Affairs call, HCGA promotes compliance with state and local laws, and provides up-to-date information, resources, and access to affiliated organizations.

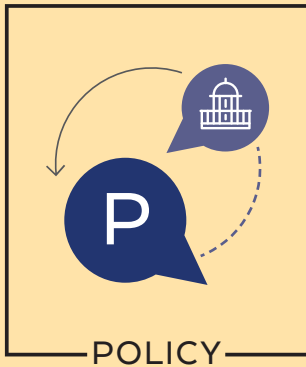

2019 Government Affairs Program

For the Humboldt County Growers Association, advocacy on public policy issues is a core function, carried out by its government relations team to promote and protect the interests of the Humboldt County cannabis industry it represents.

2019 Government Affairs Program

HCGA government relations professionals monitor proposed legislation and regulations to evaluate their impact on members. Information is presented to the membership during weekly Industry Affairs calls and via its online communication platform for group discussion and feedback. The Policy Committee, an elected and appointed decision-making body, votes to direct HCGA's policy positions. HCGA staff implements the directives of the membership, and manages HCGA's lobbying activities. Staff implements grassroots organizing programs that engage members in communicating the organization's message to policymakers.
